About the book . . .

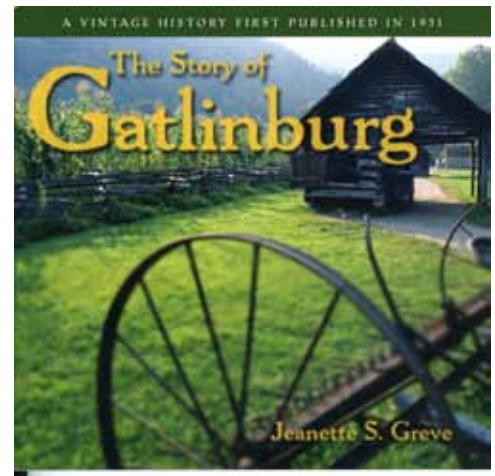
